Is My Case Right for Mediation?

- Voluntary
- Timing
- Information Needed
- Factors favorable to mediation
 - Previous attempts to resolve
 - Tenant income/Options moving foward
 - Interest in preserving relationship

Process

- Intake
- Zoom mediation scheduled
- Mediation held
- Agreement
- Next steps

Advantages of Mediation

- Confidential and free process
- No attorneys necessary
- Chance to avoid eviction
- Neutral helps find common ground
- Parties retain control
- 61% success rate
- Written agreement

Common Agreement Terms

"Pay and Stay" arrangement

Move-out date

Landlord may agree to repairs in the unit or other remedies

Other Mediation Opportunities

- Conflict with another tenant
- Other issues beyond nonpayment of rent (repairs, noise, condition of unit)
- Family, neighbor or consumer disputes
- Mediation/Conflict Management Training
